Accessible Route

Ensure a clear, obstruction-free path for easy entry and exit, accommodating wheelchairs and mobility aids.

Door Width and Clearance

- Width: Minimum 32 inches.
- Clearance: Ample space on both sides for maneuverability.

Floor Space and Turning Radius

Minimum turning radius of 60 inches for comfortable wheelchair movement.

Toilet Specifications

- Height: 17 to 19 inches from floor to top of seat.
- Clear Floor Space: At least 60 inches in front for wheelchair access
- Grab Bars: Install next to and behind the toilet for support.

Sink Requirements

- Height: Mount at a height that allows knee clearance.
- Faucet Controls: Easy-to-operate, lever-style handles preferred.

Shower and Bathtub Specifications

- Size: Minimum 36 inches wide and deep.
- Threshold: Low for easy access.
- Grab Bars: Required in showers and tubs.
- Shower Seats: Built-in or portable options.
- Hand-held Shower Head: Hose at least 59 inches long.

Accessories (Towel Bars, Mirrors, etc.)

Wheelchair Accessible Sinks and Countertops:

The guidelines say they should be at least 60 inches by 30 inches, which provides enough room for someone to easily enter with a wheelchair or shower chair. If you have the space, going larger is definitely an option! Also, the threshold for these showers should be no higher than half an inch, making it simple to roll in and out.

Shower Seat:

A built in shower seat is a fantastic addition for both safety and comfort.
